UKMT

For the first year, pupils from Llangatwg entered the United Kingdom Maths Challenge, in particular the UKMT junior challenge. The UKMT receive 700,000 entries every year from schools in the UK, making it one of the biggest maths competitions.

With the help of Mrs Hardway, our top mathematicians in year 7 and 8 completed the UKMT junior challenge with amazing results. We have had 2 Gold, 7 Silver, and 9 Bronze awards. As well as this, we had one pupil, Ben Pitts who did so well that he got through to the "Olympiad Challenge". This Olympiad Challenge is an extension round given to the top 1000 performers in the country.

Earlier this month Ben completed the challenging 2-hour paper and we await the results - Fingers crossed.





This year, the maths department utilised a pilot scheme "maths club" delivered by the Further Maths Support Programme Wales (FMSPW). This was a huge success and as a result, Miss Nicholas has continued to deliver these sessions every Thursday after school with the aim to encourage and enthuse students in years 7 to 9, with the emphasis being on fun.



NPTC

Year 10 attended the NPTC taster day last month at the 4 main campuses – Neath, Llandarcy, Afan and Pontardawe. The feedback from the pupils was very positive and all had a great day. Many commented on how it had helped them think about possible courses for after Year 11.






Art

E-sports UWTSD
































Swans Project
